biochemistry, Dr. Miller has many interests and hobbies, including researching military battle tactics. With his presentation tonight, he hopes to demonstrate that, while some scholars consider the American Civil War (1861-1865) to be the first modern war just as others point to the Napoleonic Wars (1803-1815), many of the strategies used by Civil War soldiers on both sides had been around since the 1600s.

Dr. Miller will discuss the origin of line tactics, skirmishing, trench warfare, and the impact of technological advances on Civil War battlefield tactics.

For example, "the skirmish line, which was heavily used in the Civil War, was not unique to the war," Dr. Miller pointed out in an article published in *The Alliance Review* on October 27, 2017. "These (tactics) are what are being brought to America" by emigrating Europeans.

We are pleased to welcome **Dr. Keith R. Miller**, assistant professor of chemistry at Mount Union College in Alliance, Ohio. Dr. Miller graduated from Mount Union with a B.Sc. in Chemistry. He furthered his education at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where he received his Ph.D. in Biochemistry and Biophysics.

# Fall MVCWRT tour highlights “hidden” Gettysburg



**A grand tour...** About 20 members and friends of the MVCWRT (1) joined Dan Welch, Matt Atkinson, and Rob Orrison in late September for a tour of “hidden” sites related to the Gettysburg campaign. Stops along the three-day excursion included: (2) Prospect Hall, where Meade received his orders to assume command of the Army of the Potomac; (3) a visit with Gettysburg legend Dean Schultz, whose property borders the rarely visited “Lost Road” which displays (4) the right flank marker of the Army of the Potomac; (5) the Wrightsville (PA) diorama depicting the skirmish that resulted in the burning of Wrightsville’s mile-long covered bridge across the Susquehanna River; (6) an overview of Meade’s original defensive plan, the Pipe Creek Circular; and (7) the Michigan Brigade Monument on East Cavalry Field.
