This month, November 19th commemorates the 162nd anniversary of what is arguably Abraham Lincoln's most famous utterance, a short speech

from a cemetery dedication in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. Our speaker, **Kevin Wood**, will relate the history of the United States during Lincoln's time, from his childhood on the frontier through the turbulent years from 1854 to 1865, which nearly

destroyed our nation but instead resulted in “a new birth of freedom.” Using quotes from Lincoln's best-known speeches and writings, Kevin will bring history to life with his resemblance to the 16th president and his knowledge about Lincoln's life and times.

Kevin, who hales from Adrian, Michigan, has made over 2,500 appearances as Abraham Lincoln in 39 states as well as Canada and Spain. He has impersonated Lincoln at the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum, the Lincoln Home National Historic Site, the Lincoln Heritage Museum, and the Chicago History Museum, among many others. He shares this remarkable story at a variety of venues, including libraries, museums, senior residences, schools, churches, civic / historical events, conferences, and parties, and even participates as “Running Abe” in races and triathlons.
